On Non-racism & Education - Neville Alexander

Alexander* was a leading South African intellectual whose writings and activism shaped many debates about race and racism, in which he championed a radical understanding of non-racism or anti-racism. On Robben Island for ten years as a political prisoner with Nelson Mandela and others, subsequently under house arrest for five years, he strongly criticized racial tropes, including their continued use in post-Apartheid South Africa. In this address to a 'Black' school he spells out in simple and direct terms his understanding of 'non-racism' or 'anti-racism' (18 mins: sound quality not ideal).

Thought-provoking views on the complex relationships of democracy and capitalism—and why global opinion of both appears to be waning—brief statements from top economists and political scientists who study democracy and are from, live, or work in countries that are struggling with this. Pew found that of respondents in 27 countries, 51% are dissatisfied with how democracy is working, while Millennials and Gen Zs are increasingly disinterested in capitalism.
